The Gardener's Corner

Advice from the Senior Gardeners

Even though we can't keep the flowering azaleas all summer long, we can improve our surroundings to enhance the outdoors:

- Put **pots around your patio or deck** with plants that repel mosquitoes such as lemon grass, thyme, lemon thyme, geraniums, marigolds, and rosemary.
- Do your research before shopping at a nursery or Lowes - Google "Plant this, not that". **Always look for plants native to NC** – they use less water, need less maintenance, and in some cases, have natural resistance to pests.
- **Pay attention to the calendar!** Early spring is good for planting perennial flowers, annuals love summer heat, and trees and shrubs need to go into the ground in the fall.
